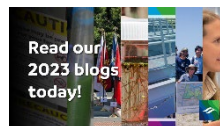


### TAKE-HOME MESSAGE

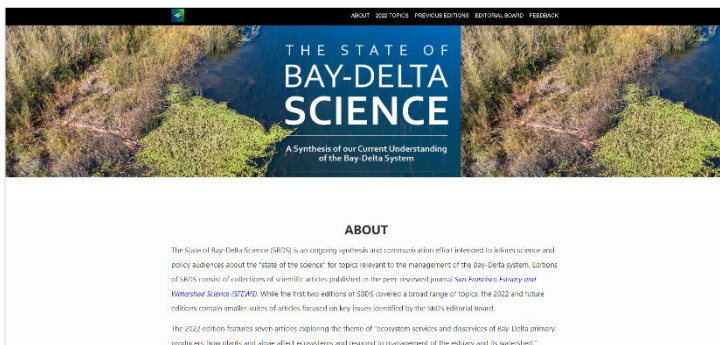
