



What is a Covered Action?

- Delta Reform Act established Council
- Legislature directed Council to develop and implement *legally enforceable* Delta Plan
- Regulatory and appellate role in certain state and local agency proposed actions – "covered actions"
- Agencies determine if proposed action is covered by one or more of 14 regulatory Delta Plan policies
- If covered, certifying agencies determine if covered action is *consistent with* the 14 regulatory policies



What is a Covered Action? Five Requirements

- Plan, program, or project as defined in Public Resources Code § 21065
- Taking place, in whole or in part, within the Delta or Suisun Marsh
- Carried out, approved, or funded by a state or local public agency
- Will have a significant impact on achieving one or both coequal goals or implementing governmentsponsored flood programs to reduce risks to people, property, and state interests in the Delta
- Covered by one or more Delta Plan regulatory policies

What is a Certification of Consistency?

- Agency submits written certification of consistency describing how covered action is consistent with regulatory policies
- Most submitted by:
 - Department of Water Resources
 - Reclamation districts
 - Flood control agencies
 - Counties and cities
- Most submitted for:
 - Ecosystem restoration projects
 - Levee projects



What is an Appeal? Who can File an Appeal?

- Certification of consistency posted on the Council's website
 - Clearinghouse for information
- Any person may appeal within 30 days
- If no person appeals, covered action may proceed
- Appeal requirements in California Code of Regulations (23 CCR §§ 5020, et seq.)

What Happens After an Appeal is Filed?

Filing an appeal begins Council's appeals process:

- Ex Parte communication prohibition
- Notice of Appeal (within 5 days of appeal)
- Full and complete record (within 5 days of notice)
- Notice of Hearing and Briefing Schedule
- Written briefs from appellant(s), certifying agency, Delta Protection Commission

What is the Delta Protection Commission's Role?

- Commission has advisory role in appeal process
- Council's procedures allow Commission to submit written brief and to address the Council regarding issues raised by an appellant in an appeal (23 CCR § 5028(a)(1).)
- Council considers Commission's comments and presentation as those of an expert agency regarding the unique cultural, recreational, and agricultural values of the Delta



What Happens at a Hearing?

- Council holds a public hearing within 60 days of appeal
- Certifying agency, appellant(s), and the Delta
 Protection Commission appear before the Council
 to present their case and/or address issues raised
 in the appeal(s)
- The public can provide comments pursuant to the Bagley-Keene Open Meeting Act

What does the Council Consider?

- Council <u>does not</u> independently review covered action to determine if consistent with Delta Plan
- Council has appellate authority and oversight over covered actions; it does not approve or condition covered actions
- Council <u>does</u> determine if evidence supports the agency's certification that covered action is consistent with Delta Plan regulations
- Appellant's burden to demonstrate lack of evidence

What is a Council Decision?

- Council issues decision with specific findings within 60 days of hearing
- Majority vote of the voting membership of the Council required to approve decision

What are the Outcomes of the Council's Decision?

- Dismiss appeals that do not identify an appealable issue, do not provide required information, or are outside Council's jurisdiction; or
- *Deny* appeals if evidence in the record supports the certification; or
- Remand the matter to the agency for reconsideration because certification not supported by substantial evidence in the record

What Happens After the Council's Decision?


- If Council dismisses and/or denies all appeals, covered action may proceed
- If Council remands, covered action cannot proceed until Council's findings addressed in revised certification
- Appeals of revised certification limited to issues remanded by the Council and/or changes to covered action

58 Certifications of consistency


- **6** Certifications appealed
